NSPCC Resources Pants campaign and Pantosaurus






Very catchy earworm of a song available on youtube about Pantosaurus and the pants rule.










The most interesting/appealing to kids.











For 5+ inclusive to IVF families, same sex parents, trans parents as talks about sperm, egg and uterus. No mention of sex Beautifully illustrated.


For 8+ Talks in much more detail about sex.

A favourite book for starting a conversation about consent. (Kids tend to rate this one above the body safety ones)



Top tips.

- Buy a range of books as not every book will work for every child.
- Some books might be better left in a bedroom for the child to read and learn about on their own (particularly puberty ones).
- Some books better to read with the parent and the value really comes from supplementing the book with conversations their own family situation and the family experience of pregnancy, birth and development.
